

School Gardening Project Meeting

Wednesday March 4th, St Julian's, 9:30 am

Please help us to get the children's gardening project started this Spring.

We need parent volunteers to help us to make the gardening project viable. We are applying for funding to have a good sized vegetable and fruit garden and involving all the children in composting (meal scraps; including cooked), and growing and selling (to the parents) their own produce, but that might take a while and meantime we want to start growing in the greenhouse this month.

The scheme will rely heavily on volunteers, however if we get a lottery grant we may be in a position to pay someone to oversee the scheme. We will need helpers for one to two hours a morning once a week, but in rotation so volunteers may only be called fortnightly depending on our numbers. We would love to involve members from the community as regular volunteers and as consultants, so if you know anyone interested, please ask them along to the meeting.

It is vital that you let us know if you can help and if at all possible PLEASE come to the planning meeting on Wednesday March 3rd at 9:30. A show of numbers at the meeting would encourage us in this project.

Is there anyone who could help us source and put shelving in the greenhouse? Preferably free and/or recycled wood.

Needed: gardening tools, seeds, seed trays and pots.
