Our vision and values are firmly rooted in a Christian narrative and help to shape and inform day to day decisions and policies. We also celebrate moments in the day and week when individual children have especially shone in our school values – adding a leaf to our values tree in the school hall. We teach our children that it is important to value who we are as a small school but to also work closely with others in our local, national and international community. Our Christian values and trust in God binds us together.
